In between the competition venues there will be Touring Sections which will be straightforward map reading, no manned controls but simple questions and a few Information boards to be recorded along the way. The route follows the more minor roads as much as possible, not highways, and is very interesting and scenic.

The event kicks off at Stawell at 0800 on Saturday morning, so it may be a good plan to stay overnight in the area, we plan to meet for an informal dinner on Friday evening. Overnight on Saturday will be in Stawell

SUPPLEMENTARY REGULATIONS

1. THE EVENT

The Event shall be known as the Grampians Tour, hereinafter referred to as “the Event”.

The Event will visit a series of Closed Road Sections on forestry roads over a period of two days.

The Closed Road Sections will be joined by Touring Sections with straightforward Map Reading.

The Event will be a Multi Club Road Event with closed road sub events, conducted over public and private roads in Victoria on the 20th and 21st of July 2019.

The Event is a Multi-Club Event open to financial members of CAMS clubs.

2. SCHEDULE OF DATES

Entries Open: Upon publication of these Regulations

Entries Close: 1800 Wednesday 17th of July 2019

Further Instructions issued: Sunday 14th of July 2019

Scrutiny: Thursday 18th of July 2019

Crew Briefing Saturday 20th of July at start.

Event Start: Saturday 20th of July at Stawell.

Event Finish: Sunday 21st of July at Avoca.

3. AUTHORITY

The Event shall be held under the:

- The FIA International Sporting Code including Appendices
- The National Competition Rules of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Limited (CAMS).
- The National Rally Code
- The National Road Event Regulations
- These Supplementary Regulations, any Further Regulations, Instructions, Event Bulletins and Route Instructions, which may be issued.

The CAMS Permit Number 319/2107/01 authorising this Event will be displayed at the start.

This Event will be conducted under and in accordance with CAMS OH&S and Risk Management Policies, which can be found on the CAMS website at www.cams.com.au

Certain public, property, professional indemnity and personal accident insurance is provided by CAMS in relation to the Event. Further details can be found in the CAMS Insurance Handbook, available at www.cams.com.au.

4. ORGANISATION

4.1 The Event shall be organised and promoted by:

4.2 In accordance with CAMS NCR 59, the Organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the Event if in their opinion the entries are insufficient or by “Force Majeure”. The organisers reserve the right to postpone, abandon, cancel, terminate or alter the Event at any time.

6. CREW ELIGIBILITY

- 6.1 Crews shall consist of at least two persons. The maximum number of persons in the Crew shall be subject to vehicle capacity and relevant civil regulations. The Driver(s) must hold a current civil driving licence.
- 6.2 The Competitor and Crew Members shall be required to hold a current CAMS Level 2S (Crew Members not intending to drive in the Speed Sub Events will only be required to hold a 2NS) or superior licence.
- 6.3 It is highly recommended that all crews have a current Ambulance membership or equivalent.
- 6.4 The Competitor (formerly known as Entrant) and all Crew Members must be financial members of a CAMS affiliated Club. The Event will be open to all grades of Competitors.

7. VEHICLE ELIGIBILITY

- 7.1 Vehicles must be in a roadworthy condition at all times during the Event.
- 7.2 Vehicles are generally limited to 2WD non-turbo models; other entries may be accepted at the discretion of the organisers taking into account historical significance of car or Crew. Please contact the Clerk of the Course if you have any queries on vehicle suitability.
Modifications of all types are permitted but the car must be registered (or have a historic/rally permit) and be road legal. Engine and chassis numbers must agree with certificate of registration (or permit). Vehicles will be scrutineered for safety and compliance with these Supplementary Regulations prior to the start and during the Event. Vehicles must be adequately muffled to comply with noise restrictions. Fuel must comply with Schedule G of the current CAMS Manual.
- 7.3 All vehicles must comply with the requirements of Schedule R of the current CAMS Manual and the Touring Road Event Regulations.

8. ENTRIES

- 8.1 Entries will be only accepted on the official Entry Form, complete in all details, save that car details may be confirmed at a later date.
- 8.2 The Entry Fee is \$380
The Entry Fee includes:
- CAMS Permit Fees, including public liability insurance
 - Rally Entry (including hire of venues and safety equipment)
 - One set of official maps and instructions
 - Set of car numbers and personal identification badges and other paraphernalia.
 - Competitors will be required to organise and pay for their own accommodation, food and fuel.
 - Also, provision of professional first aid services.

- 8.3 Entries must be forwarded to the **Clerk of Course** and accompanied by the Entry Fee. Cheques are to be made payable to "**Historic Rally Association (inc)**". If electing to pay by electronic deposit you **MUST** attach a copy of the EFT receipt to the entry form. In the payment description field, please use the three letter Event code "GRT" followed by the "Competitor's Surname":

- 8.4 Competitors under the age of 18 must have the written consent of a parent or guardian to enter and participate.
- 8.6 Entries may be refused in accordance with NCR 83 of the current CAMS Manual.
- 8.7 Entries are limited to 35, accepted in order of receipt.

9. STARTING ORDER

The starting order will be determined and allocated by the Organisers.

10. SCRUTINY, EQUIPMENT & PAPERWORK

- 10.1 Official Scrutiny will be conducted on Thursday the 18th of July at Performance Exhaust, FACTORY 20/10 Henderson Rd, Knoxfield VIC from 1800. Competitors not close to official locations will be advised of regional Scrutineers in their area.
- 10.2 Vehicles must be presented at scrutiny in a clean and "ready to start" condition.

Compulsory equipment will be checked, as follows:

- Seat belt of least three point mounting for each occupant.
- Two (2) safety triangles
- Mud flaps of stout material for both rear wheels. (Also for the front wheels if they are the driving wheels).
- A first aid kit, as per Schedule R of the CAMS manual.
- Fire Extinguisher(s) compliant with CAMS Schedule H of the current CAMS Manual, e.g. Dry Powder type of total capacity 2 kgs. Note: BCF type extinguishers are not permitted by civil legislation.
- Vehicles shall have sound towing points fitted front and rear. Additional bonnet straps or pins will not be required.
- Red SOS / Green OK board.
- Helmets for both crew members.

The following documentation must be presented at Scrutiny:

- Current vehicle registration papers/permit showing ownership and verifying the vehicle engine number.
- Entrant's and all Crew Members' current competition licence. (refer to Article 6.2)
- Current CAMS affiliated car club membership card
- Civil driving licence of each Crew Member that may drive on public roads during the Event.

11. RUNNING DETAILS

- 11.1 The Event will start from Stawell at 0900 on the 20th July.
- 11.2 There will be a Competitor Briefing just before the start.
- 11.3 The Event will be run over approx. 450 km of sealed roads, unsealed roads, tracks & private property.
- 11.4 There will be an overnight stop at Stawell on the Saturday evening.
- 11.5 The Event will finish at Avoca.

- 11.6 No special car preparation, except for the vehicle requirements stipulated in these regulations will be required, although cars will need to be in good mechanical condition.
- 11.7 The Event will consist of Touring Sections with Competitive Sub Events.

The Touring Sections will consist of very straightforward map reading with route charts used from time to time. Our aim is to find interesting areas and roads, most of the area used sees little traffic. **12.2 Touring sections** will not be timed but will be scored as a 60 minute penalty for missed time controls. These time controls will be open for a certain period of time and Crews will be permitted to book in and out at any time during that time "window" Liberal amounts of time will be allowed for these sections, points should only be dropped if the Competitors have problems. Navigation will be straightforward, we have to cover a fair distance per day as well as compete in the sub Events. There will be questions to be answered during the touring sections Placings in each touring section will be scored as for a sub event.

If you arrive at the time control at the end of a Touring section very late it may have closed and you will be deemed to have missed the control. If you miss a time control you will be required to report your whereabouts to the Event Organisers.

Closed Road Sections

These are timed to the second sections run on closed forestry roads.

You will gain demerit points (see below) in accordance with your placing in each sub Event, if you don't participate you will simply receive the maximum points loss for that sub Event.

- 11.8 The road rules must be obeyed at all times during the Event with exception of the sub Events.

Alcohol, Drugs and Other Substances

Any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may be tested for the presence of drugs (or other banned substances) and subject to a penalty(ies) for a breach in accordance with the CAMS Anti-Doping Policy and/or the CAMS Illicit Drugs in Sport (Safety Testing) Policy as published on the CAMS website. Consumption of alcohol in the paddock, pits or any section of the competition venue/course under the control of the Officials is forbidden until all competition is concluded each day.

Accordingly, any holder of a CAMS 'Competition' or 'Officials' licence (or equivalent licence issued by another ASN) may also be tested for the presence of alcohol by a CAMS Accredited Testing Official (CATO) in accordance with the CAMS Standard Operating Procedure for Breath Alcohol Testing.

Competitor Safety
In accordance with Appendix D of the CAMS Manual, safety helmets as specified must be worn by Drivers whenever competing on the Circuit/Track. Clothing must extend from ankles to neck to wrists. Clothing and footwear of flammable synthetic material, such as nylon, is not acceptable.

A qualified first aid officer will be in attendance at all speed sub Events.

Timing: The competing cars may be timed either by automatic means or by hand-operated stop watches. If a Driver fails to complete a run due to any other cause outside the Driver's control, he shall be permitted a re-run.

12. SCORING

Each run of each Sub-Event of the Event will be scored individually. Points will be awarded in order of finishing from highest to lowest as follows:

1st = 0 points, 2nd = 1 point, 3rd = 2 points, 4th = 3 points, and so on down to the last Competitor.

In the Event of "Tied Places", the average of the scores for those places will be awarded to each Crew. Thus, if three Crews tied for second place, add 1+2+3 = 6, divided by 3 = 2 points per Crew.

Points lost after sub Event and Touring Section placings have determined will be added together to give the Competitors total points loss for the Event at that point.

13. JUDGES OF FACT

Control Officials will be deemed judges of fact with respect to time and direction of entry to controls and passage controls, activity in control and exhaust system efficiency.

14. **OFFICIAL MAPS**

15. **PROTESTS**

Must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the National Competition Rules.

16. **AWARDS**

Trophies will be awarded for the first three placegetters. Further awards will be published in further regulations/ instructions and will reflect the nature of the entries received.

Activities. I **acknowledge** that:

- the risks associated with attending or participating in Motor Sport Activities include but are **NOT LIMITED** to the risk that I may suffer harm as a result of:
 - motor vehicles (or parts of them) colliding with other motor vehicles or persons or property;
 - others participants acting dangerously or with lack of skills;
 - high levels of noise exposure;
 - acts of violence and other harmful acts (whether intentional or inadvertent) committed by persons attending or participating in the event; and
 - the failure or unsuitability of facilities (including grand-stands, fences and guard rails) to ensure my safety.

EXCLUSION OF LIABILITY, RELEASE & INDEMNITY

In exchange for being able to attend or participate in the Motor Sport Activities, I **agree**:

- to **release** CAMS and the Entities to the extent that any or all of them are providing Recreational Services from all liability for:
 - α) my **death**;
 - β) any **physical or mental injury** (including the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of such an injury);
 - γ) the contraction, aggravation or acceleration of a **disease**;
 - δ) the coming into existence, the aggravation, acceleration or recurrence of any other **condition, circumstance, occurrence, activity, form of behavior, course of conduct or state of affairs**:
 - i. that is or may be harmful or disadvantageous to me or the community; or
 - ii. that may result in harm or disadvantage to me or the community,
- to **indemnify and hold harmless and keep indemnified** the Entities to the maximum extent permitted by law in respect of any Claim by any person; and
- to attend at or participate in the Motor Sport Activities **at my own risk**. I **understand** that:
 - nothing in this document excludes, restricts or modifies any rights that I may have as a result of significant personal injury that is caused by the Reckless Conduct of the Entities as the supplier of the Motor Sport Activities / Recreational Services;
 - nothing in this document prevents the Entities from relying on any laws (including statute and common law) that limit or preclude their liability;
 - nothing in this document excludes any term or guarantee which under statute cannot be excluded; however the liability of the Entities is limited to the minimum liability allowable by law;
 - nothing in this document precludes me from making a claim under a CAMS insurance policy where I am expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy; and
 - CAMS has arranged some limited personal injury insurance coverage which may provide me with some protection for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motor Sport Activities. However, I acknowledge and accept that the insurance taken out by CAMS may not provide me with full indemnity for loss, damage or injury that I may suffer during my participation in the Motor Sport Activities, and that I may have to pay the excess if a Claim is made under an insurance policy on my behalf. I agree that my own insurance arrangements are ultimately my responsibility and I will arrange any additional coverage at my expense after taking into account CAMS insurance arrangements, this document and my own circumstances.

WARNING APPLICABLE IN RELATION TO MOTOR SPORT ACTIVITIES HELD IN VICTORIA

WARNING UNDER THE AUSTRALIAN CONSUMER LAW AND FAIR TRADING ACT

2012:

Under the Australian Consumer Law (Victoria), several statutory guarantees apply to the supply of certain goods and services. These guarantees mean that the supplier named on this form is required to ensure that the recreational services it supplies to you:

- are rendered with due care and skill;
- are reasonably fit for any purpose which you either expressly or by implication, make known to the supplier; and
- might reasonably be expected to achieve any result you have made known to the supplier.

Under section 22 of the **Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012 (Vic)**, the supplier is entitled to ask you to agree

that these conditions do not apply to you. If you sign this form, you will be agreeing that your rights to sue the supplier under the **Australian Consumer Law and Fair Trading Act 2012** if you are killed or injured because the services were not in accordance with these guarantees, are excluded, restricted or modified in the way set out in this form.

Important:

You do not have to agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form. The supplier may refuse to provide you with the services if you do not agree to exclude, restrict or modify your rights by signing this form. Even if you sign this form, you may still have further legal rights against the supplier. A child under the age of 18 cannot legally agree to exclude, restrict or modify his or her rights. - b. "Claim" means and includes any action, suit, proceeding, claim, demand or cause of action however arising including but not limited to negligence, BUT does **NOT** include a claim under a CAMS insurance policy by any person expressly entitled to make a claim under that insurance policy;
- c. "Entities" means event and competition organisers/promoters/managers, land and track owners/managers/administrators/lessees, CAMS affiliated clubs, state and territory governments and insured listed in CAMS' public/product/professional indemnity insurance policies **and** each of their related bodies corporate (including their related bodies corporate) **and** each of their organs and agencies, officers/president/directors/executives, employees, servants, agents, partners, providers, members, competitors, drivers, co-drivers, navigators, officials, crew members, pit crew, delegates, licence holders, representatives, commissions, committees, advisers, trustees, councils, panels, shareholders, volunteers, officials, appointees, delegated bodies and sponsors.
- d. "Motor Sport Activities" means any motor sport activities or Recreational Services which are permitted or approved which CAMS regulates or administers by CAMS or otherwise under the responsibility / control of CAMS;
- e. "Reckless Conduct" means conduct where the supplier of the recreational services is aware, or should reasonably have been aware, of a significant risk that the conduct could result in personal injury to another person and engages in the conduct despite the risk and without adequate justification;
- f. "Recreational Services" means (unless otherwise defined in this document) services that consist of participation in:
 - a) a sporting activity; or
 - b) a similar leisure time pursuit or any other activity that:
 - (i) involves a significant degree of physical exertion or physical risk; and
 - (ii) is undertaken for the purposes of recreation, enjoyment or leisure.
